

Tobacco Products Directive: current situation & next steps

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Before the proposal – postponing the indispensable?



Necessity to adapt the current rules on tobacco

- Market developments → novel tobacco products
- Scientific studies → toxicity of ingredients
- International committments → WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control

BUT

Delayed for several months

— Scandals & procrastination → tobacco industry behind the scene?



"Together is stronger"

<u>Initial priorities</u> identified since 2010 and the EC public consultation on the revision of the current directive





- Plain packaging
- 2. 80% combined text and pictorial health warnings on the front and back
- 3. Cessation information as part of the health warnings
- 4. Warnings on tar, nicotine and carbon monoxide levels












The negotiations phase — sit at the decision-making table!



Wider network

 Alignment meetings: joint efforts of public health NGOs, patients, doctors, academics

Advocacy efforts

- Meetings with EU policy-makers and national authorities
- Joint communication & raise awareness campaigns

A healthy future for our children



75% warnings at **the top edge of the pack** reduce the attractiveness of cigarette packs

SUPPORT AMENDMENT 54 or tobacco interests?



50% warnings at the bottom edge of the pack do not prevent Big Tobacco from attracting kids

REJECT AMENDMENTS 97, 98, 120, 142, 150

Key word: adaptability

From the Commission's proposal...

- Plain standardised packaging
- Combined warnings placed on the top and covering 80% of packages
- Comprehensive ban on characterising flavours
- 4. Ban on slim cigarettes
- 5. Ban on oral tobacco products
- 6. Ban on online sales
- Stronger measures against illicit trade
- 8. Regulation of e-cigarettes

...to the ENVI vote

- Combined health warnings covering 75% of the front and back of tobacco products packages
- Health warnings to be placed on the top part of packages
- 3. Comprehensive ban on characterising flavours
- 4. Ban on slim cigarettes
- Stronger measures against illicit trade
- 6. Regulation of e-cigarettes



The mouse vs. the elephant?

€5 million a year + over 150 full-time lobbyists from the tobacco industry vs. around 10 public health NGOs

HOWEVER

Some positive provisions were introduced

Current rules	New measures
30% on the back and 40% on the front placed at the bottom	65% at the top on both sides
Pictures compulsory only in 10 Member States	Compulsory pictorial warnings
Additives allowed	Additives are forbidden
Fancy and slim packages allowed	Packages' shape harmonised





Towards the final decision — the last efforts



Council position = EP plenary

- Phase-out period for higher sales volume products (menthol)
- Slims allowed
- Prohibition of cross-border distance sales
- Insertion of waterpipes, exclusion of regulation on snus
- 65% combined health warnings

Council position ≠ EP plenary

E-cigarettes regulated as medicinal products



One battle has ended, the war is still on

Single Members of the European Parliament have no more voice in the dossier – negotiations between the rapporteur of the European Parliament, the Presidency of the Council of the EU and the Commission

<u>Expected outcome:</u> before next EP elections (May 2014), McAvan's wish before Christmas

Legislations are updated every 10 years or so, this is the moment to make the difference for public health in Europe!!!

- → Write to your national Ministries
- → Keep the contacts with the Lithuanian Presidency, European Parliament rapporteur and Commission
- → Raise awareness on tobacco ahead of next EP elections
